News

Outer Space Act - Euros 60 million cap on unlimited indemnity

The SFN announced on 23 July 2015 that the current unlimited indemnity in the UK Outer Space Act 1986 will be capped at €60m from 1 October 2015. The SFN have been pushing for this change in legislation for over 4 years and are delighted that this has now come to fruition.

UK National Space Policy

The UK Government launched the UK National Space Policy on 15 December 2015 - a commitment by 26 UK Government organisations and partners to strengthen the UK's capacity to capitalise on the social and economic advantages resulting from space science and satellite technology. The aim is to grow the UK space sector to 10% of the global space market by 2030.

Regulation for CubeSats

The UK Space Agency (UKSA) has conducted a review to assess how its regulatory approach may need to be amended to deal with the particular issues which are raised by CubeSat systems. The UKSA recognise that there is an opportunity to use a range of pre-determined technical assessments and associated likely outcomes for a range of CubeSat systems, and that these can be presented in the form of a traffic light system.

The outcome of the internal review conducted by the UKSA is a series of recommendations, detailed on its website. The UKSA has invited responses from the space community on these proposals and we would encourage interested companies to liaise with the UKSA in this regard.

Elevator Pitch Events

Training and pitching events 2015

With the kind sponsorship and support of InnovateUK and the KTN, the SFN invited companies to apply to be selected for elevator pitch training and then to attend an elevator pitch event, where they pitched in front of potential investors. Nine companies were selected to attend the training and the elevator pitch event: Democrata; Effective Space Solutions; Sherlock; Weather Safe; Sixty-5; Bird-i; Adaptix; FATMAP; and RealTag. We are aware that several of these companies have already received offers of finance.

Thank you to Bruce Colley from InnovateUK, Richard Brook from E-Synergy, Antonia Jenkinson from the Satellite Applications Catapult and Struan Penwarden from Bird & Bird for their able support, training and advice to the companies.


